#### WHY do you understand God's TRUTH?

The severity of our responsibility can be discovered in Matthew 24:22, "And unless those days were shortened, no flesh would be saved, but for the elect's sake, those days will be shortened." Now do we understand?

Brethren, those of us who properly responded to God's call at this time (John 6:44), became God's elect. If we were called, repented of our sins, were baptized, and received God's Holy Spirit, then dedicated our lives to God's service, we are part of that select group. Think about it. 
#### **WE ARE THE ELECT**

is a deadly serious affair, a life and death responsibility. Millions of lives depend on us. Let's all hold fast and do our job -- for them!

DNA. Most of us are familiar with this scientific and medical term -- a complicated design function that all human beings, and in fact, all living organisms possess. But do we understand the complexity and wonder of DNA, and can we see a duality here concerning the comparison of physical DNA and spiritual "DNA?"

what DNA is. There are multiple definitions of DNA in both medical and scientific sources, but to simplify, DNA, located in practically every cell in our bodies, contains our hereditary material and our genes -- the fundamental and distinct characteristics of someone or something that make each one unique -- as well as the instructions necessary for growth, development, and reproduction. The instructions necessary for life itself. Combined with environmental and social contexts, DNA gives us our abilities, our health, and our basic behavior. In other words, DNA makes each of us who we are!

So now that we know what physical DNA encompasses -- basically individual characteristics -- let's look at the concept of SPIRITUAL "DNA."

There are two types of spiritual "DNA" that we are dealing with today, two very different types of "DNA" -- Satan's "DNA" and God's "DNA." In **Galatians 5:19 - 23**, we can see these clear and distinct descriptions of characteristics of both Satan and God.

First, let's examine the characteristics of Satan's "DNA." Using the Tyndale version of the Bible, in **Galatians 5:19-21**, the characteristics, or works, of Satan are vividly described. **"But when you** 

follow your own wrong inclinations, your lives will produce these evil results: impure thoughts, eagerness for lustful pleasure, idolatry, spiritualism (that is encouraging the activity of demons), hatred, infighting, jealousy, and anger. Consider the constant effort to get the best for yourself, complaints, criticism, the feeling that everyone else is wrong except for those in your own little group. And there will be wrong doctrine, envy, murder, drunkenness, wild parties and all those sorts of things. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the kingdom of God."

GOD'S "DNA"

So now, we can look at what God's "DNA" is. Simply, it is His Holy Spirit!

If we refer to **Romans 8:9**, we can see that if we don't have God's Holy Spirit, then we have

Satan's "DNA." "But you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His."

So now, we can look at what God's "DNA" is. Simply, it is His Holy Spirit! The actual message Romans 8:9 gives us could be stated as, "If you do not have my spirit, my "DNA" (says God), if I cannot recognize you as having my qualities, you aren't mine! Let me repeat -- you aren't

mine. And God's characteristics are clearly outlined for us in Galatians 5:22-23, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law." God's Holy Spirit produces these fruits, His fruits, in us, and together with God's law, there is no conflict in us. It is obvious that there are two types of spiritual "DNA," completely different, producing different fruits. We must be developing the characteristics of God's Holy Spirit, His "DNA", and we should be asking ourselves, "How much of God's "DNA" do we have at this point in our lives, at this juncture of our spiritual development?"

To help us visualize and better remember what, exactly, we are talking about concerning God's "DNA," we will present an acronym, an expanded acronym if you will, to detail this information concisely.

- **D DESTINATION:** The destination is God's Kingdom and our relationship to it.
- N NAME: This refers to God's Family Name; OUR NAME as members of His Family in the future.
- **A ATTRIBUTES:** We must possess godly attributes, or characteristics. All the factors

above work in tandem together to point us toward God and our potential future destiny with Him -- as members of His Family, along with Jesus Christ. As we travel through the challenges of our lives, we must keep in mind our goal as true Christians, our destination of God's

...to reach the goal, or destination, and obtain the NAME of God's Family, we must be developing the attributes of Godly character in our lives now.

(Galatians 5:22-23)

Kingdom, reachable at the return of Jesus Christ to this earth (Luke 1:32-33; Luke 12:32; James 2:5; 2 Peter 1:11; Isaiah 9:7; Daniel 2:44). At that time, we will take on the name of God's Family as working members of that family (Ephesians 3:14-15, Psalm 8:1, Psalm 8:9). Rulers and teachers in the World Tomorrow -- pillars in God's Temple. And to do so, to reach the goal, or destination, and obtain the name of God's Family, we must be developing the attributes of Godly character in our lives now (Galatians 5:22-23).

#### **TEACHING AND TRAINING**

In my recent sermonettes, you have heard me talk about my Equine Massage Academy for Horse and Rider, and my background at Ambassador College. Mr. Armstrong, founder of Ambassador College, used to refer to the College as God's WEST POINT of the Work. Perhaps you remember this yourself. This is where students were to be trained to be the best they could be, to bring out the best characteristics in each of them. This was God's West Point.

There was something very special about the

Ambassador College education, especially in the way the college interacted with each student. The education was all encompassing, in the way that everything was provided for each student - delicious, wholesome meals, quality educational experiences, and even work, so the students could pay off their tuition. These were optimum conditions for each person to receive an excellent education and concentrate on individual development, which would serve them well for their future successes. The whole point was that these were God's Ambassadors in training, just as we are today. And there are multiple lessons we can each learn from that example.

When I pioneered my school, I wasn't sure how to teach the subject of equine massage. I didn't know the best way to teach. But a couple of years into it, I applied the Ambassador College concept, a concept that would create, on a physical level, a superior method for students to learn the curriculum of horse massage and to develop their talents and abilities in the field and in their personal lives. So, I created an umbrella education. The students just show up and my academy will feed them, lodge them, teach them, and will be there for them, guiding them to become the best they can be.

I love the job of a teacher and love the idea that I was trying to follow in the footsteps of the

Ambassador College curriculum in character development, God's West Point education, if you will. It has been a tremendous training and growth experience for me as well as my students!

There have been some amazing things that have taken place in my program over the years that encourage me, and hopefully you, the reader, as well. Students come from all different backgrounds, carrying diverse experiences, when they attend my school. As with any interaction we might have with any other human being, we often don't know the impact we can make with another person, but I have been extremely blessed and inspired to hear how successful the lessons, not just in horse massage, but also by displaying God's way of life, have been for some of my students. One woman emailed me, stating, "I came to your school to learn how to massage a horse because I was planning on divorcing my husband. I didn't think he would want to be involved with any of my horse activities. Then something you said in your school, something that came out of your mouth, your

that came out of your mouth, your philosophies, how you thought, got my attention. I went back to reading the Bible and I fell in love with my husband all over again!"

Years later, I spoke with her and learned that she and her husband had a son now, and that she was planning to send him to my school one day. This was encouraging and uplifting for me to learn. But that was not all. Another woman who attended my school made big changes in her life and was excited about what she, too, learned, and began to apply the lessons to her life.

Unfortunately, she developed inoperable cancer. When I heard the news, I contacted her and she told me she was dying, but she was still happy and positive. When I asked her how this was possible, she said, "Because of you. It's what you taught me in school. It's what you said and how you said it and who you are!"

#### **INCREDIBLE HUMAN POTENTIAL**

How inspiring for me to see an example of how God works in us and how we can use our gift of God's Holy Spirit -- those special characteristics -- to grow in each of us if we let it, and to flow out from us to others if we apply God's laws


correctly. I applied the education and example of Ambassador College physically in my life, as the founder and teacher of my own Equine Massage Academy for Horse and Rider, and am using what I have learned to serve others. I want to use God's Spirit, God's "DNA," as all of us must, and use what I've learned from God's West Point spiritually, as well as physically, to help others develop their incredible human potential.

God's "DNA" is so valuable to have in our lives. We must be focused and aware, wanting to develop it to the maximum level we can in the time we have in our lives. We only have this short span of time to develop the characteristics of Godly "DNA" -- to reach that destination (Daniel 7:18), with the God Family Name (Isaiah 56:5),

# "In This Manner, Therefore Pray:"

In Jesus Christ's prayer
outline, He gave His disciples
an example of how to pray
(Matthew 6:9-13). "In this
manner, therefore, pray: Our
Father in heaven..." Jesus
opened His prayer by praying
to the Father. Does this mean
we can never address Christ
in a prayer? Is speaking to
Christ blasphemous? What
did God's end-time apostle
(Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong),
teach on this subject? We
should know!

esus had a close personal relationship with God the Father. There are many examples where we see His prayers and supplications given before God. "Now it came to pass in those days that He [Jesus] went out to the mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God" (Luke 6:12).

"And being in agony, He [Jesus] prayed more earnestly. Then His sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the ground" (Luke 22:44).

"During his life on earth, Jesus prayed to God, who could save him from death. He prayed and pleaded with loud crying and tears, and he was heard because of his devotion to God" (Hebrews 5:7 - GW).

Christ's earnest, fervent prayers to the Father made His victory over sin and death possible. We, too, can have a close personal relationship with God. God speaks to us through the pages of His Bible. We communicate with and talk to Him through our frequent, heartfelt prayers.

Christ's disciples were very much aware that Jesus, their teacher, had close contact with God the Father, and would call upon His name consistently, asking for His help in everything. As a result, one of Jesus' disciples asked Him to teach them (the disciples), how to pray. This prayer example is the spiritual outline that gives us real results and the spiritual "framework" we should build our prayers around.

"Now it came to pass, as He [Jesus] was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, that one of His disciples said to Him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples"" (Luke 11:1). Jesus then went on to give His disciples instructions on how to pray rightly, meaningfully, and effectively.

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[Jesus] was praying in a certain
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(Luke 11:1)

He taught His disciples to pray, "In this manner..." (Matthew 6:9). In other words, they were to pray in a <u>SIMILAR</u> way, or "MANNER." He was not intending for the disciples to use His sample prayer as something to say repetitively. In fact, in verse 7 we can read where Jesus told them not to be repetitive with their prayers. "And when you pray, do not use vain repetitions as the heathen do. For they think that they will be heard for their many words" (Matthew 6:7).

Nowhere in scripture do we find where Christ told His disciples to memorize this prayer and repeat it to God when they approach His throne. Again, Christ was simply outlining the proper application of prayer, and some of the basic points we should be asking God for when we pray.

#### PRAYING TO THE FATHER

If we follow the outline given in Luke 11 and in Matthew 6, we will find that Christ opened His prayer with "... Our FATHER in heaven, Hallowed be Your name..." (Mathew 6:9). Christ clearly opened His prayer by praying to the Father. He revealed the Father to His disciples. That's exactly what He has taught us to do as well! When we pray, we speak directly to the Father. That was Christ's instruction!

We also see in verses 5-6, that when we pray, we are to go into a private place, praying to the <u>FATHER</u>. "And when you pray, you shall not be like the hypocrites. For they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the corners of the streets, that they may be seen by men. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you pray, go into your room, and when you have shut your door, <u>pray to your Father</u> who *is* in the secret place; and <u>your Father</u> who sees in secret will reward you openly" (Matthew 6:5-6).

Our deep heartfelt prayers to the FATHER will help us to build a closer personal relationship with Him. "For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the spirit of sonship. When we cry, "Abba! Father!"" (Romans 8:15 - RSV). The phrase "Abba Father" is often translated to mean "Daddy, Father." That IS the kind of relationship our Father wants us to have with Him.

Jesus instructed His disciples to PRAY TO THE FATHER in His (Christ's) name. "And in that day you will ask Me nothing. Most assuredly, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you" (John 16:23). When we pray to the Father, we are to give that prayer in the name of Christ our High Priest, by HIS authority. That's why we end a prayer to the Father by referencing Christ's name, as He instructed. Through Christ, we are given access to the Father (Ephesians 2:18).

We have seven days to look at ourselves. To dig and dig and dig and ask God to show us the hidden sins in our lives, the things that we don't see, and to strengthen us in our weak areas that we have been trying to overcome. Sometimes we can get a defeatist attitude and emotionally beat ourselves up, so to speak, and see nothing but problems, trials, and challenges. Do we see the parallel here in what this lady is praising her husband for with characteristics that God has displayed to us? There is a lot in this list as I go through it. I remember Mr.

- **3).** God's values never change, He is always consistent (Malachi 3:6).
- 4). "God takes care of me with His great blessings (Malachi 3:10).

- 5). God is full of loving-kindness (Psalm 51).
- 6). I am precious in God's sight (I Peter 3:4).
- **7).** God will never leave me nor forsake me (Isaiah 49:15).



- **8).** God speaks to me. I am led by his great power. Sometimes it's unexpected thoughts, but oftentimes it's in reading his scriptures. God speaks to me, and I'm led by <u>HIS</u> power (John 14).
- **9).** The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall never be wanting. Wow! What kind of security is THAT? Never to be wanting. God takes care of His sheep, and we are His sheep (Psalm 23).
- 10). God's plan for mankind (I John 3:1-2; I Corinthians 2:9; Romans 8:29).

The list is really a very endless list, it seems to me. King David lists the greatness of God in the Psalms. You can look at all what King David said -- what he listed in there -- of why he loved God.

Thinking of these reasons alone, we need to expand the basic meaning of each into the depth of each reason listed. For instance, where would our society be without laws? Laws that keep us safe? Well, we are seeing less and less adherence to laws, and more violence due to breaking those laws. But do we stop and think how blessed we are to keep God's laws? Well,

God gives me laws which keep me safe. (Deuteronomy 5).

Here's another reason that is not only so important to us, but also important to one's mate, and even society, and that is something

to love God because of. His consistency. He never, ever changes (Malachi 3:6). He holds a standard, the gold standard, if you will, and that's what we're doing right now. By recognizing these standards, we should be trying to put out the substandard things in our lives that don't belong there. It's a journey and it's a long journey. And it won't happen overnight. But if we focus on the wonder of God, the stresses and depressing things of the world will affect us

less. Thankfully, God knows how much work we must go through. He is always there to help us. Well, we can stop right there and remember that's what God does for us. He searches us and he wants us to know Him.

As we each begin to compile our own list of the reasons we each personally love God, it would be good to go through the hymnal. What a study tool we have at our fingertips! It's an interesting thing about our hymnal, because all these reasons to love God are listed in the hymns that we sing each Sabbath.

Remember, as we study Him and know Him and love Him -- become more like Him -- we also become Him.

#### **MOVING FORWARD**

So, as we approach the fall Holy Days, we are going to continue to discover things in our lives which may depress us because we may have overlooked them. But we need to be encouraged as well. Sometimes we just simply need to stop and take note and review the reasons why we love God. So, this might be a good list to put together. When we see the goodness of God, as we think about why we

love God, it takes us back to one scripture. As it says in the latter half of Romans 2:4, "... the goodness of God leads you to repentance..." It's HIS goodness that we must look for, search, and recognize that goodness and His love for us as exhibited in the Holy Days. They lay out God's Master Plan for all mankind. We looked, we heeded; we paid



attention. Now it's time to act.

So, the list... How big is our "I love God because..." list going to be? Well, it could be quite extensive, as there are so many promises found in scriptures that we can read and take inspiration from. So many miracles and

blessings in our personal lives that God has bestowed upon us.

God, I love you because... ◆

The apostle Paul (as well as all the apostles), prayed directly to God our Father (Ephesians 3:11-14; Colossians 1:3; Ephesians 5:20; I Peter 1:17). So, as we see, prayers are to be given directly to our Father in Heaven. However, there is no place in scripture that prevents us from also speaking to Christ!

#### THE QUESTION IS...

Now, the question is: Since we pray to the Father, does that mean it is a sin, or it's blasphemous, to even address Jesus Christ in a prayer? What did God's apostle (Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong), teach? Here are Mr. Armstrong's words as found in the *Good News* magazine, May 1960: "We have access direct to the FATHER -- and also to JESUS Christ! Many times DAILY we may go into intimate COMMUNION with BOTH God and Christ – our FATHER and our BROTHER! ... God's Church

certainly does not forbid members to commune with and pray to Christ Jesus -- but neither must we leave UNDONE the communion and fellowship with and prayers to THE FATHER, who is the HEAD of Christ, and of all that is!"

Also, in a World Tomorrow broadcast entitled, "Christ Our High Priest: Hebrews 4," Mr.

Armstrong reiterated the fact that one can pray directly to Christ. He said, "Yes, He [Christ] is the mediator. My friends, you don't need to pray to some dead woman. You don't need to pray to any dead saint. You can pray directly to the Lord Jesus Christ at the right hand of God, the Living Savior. I want to show you how great He is."

Yes, Jesus Christ sits at the right hand of God (Hebrews 12:2). Our prayers should always begin by addressing our FATHER, as Christ taught. However, it is <u>NOT</u> sin, nor is it blasphemous, to speak directly to Christ also, in a prayer! ◆

#### Elijah to Come in Our Day

Remember, once again, God's principle of duality. As Jesus said in Matthew, the prophecy of Malachi 3:1 applied to John the Baptist in type; but if you will continue reading through verse 5, it becomes very clear that the prophecy is speaking of one to prepare the way before the Second Coming of Christ. John the Baptist was a voice crying out in the physical wilderness of the Jordan River, preparing the way for the First Coming of Christ, as a physical human being, to his physical Temple at Jerusalem and to the physical people of Judah, announcing the advance good news that the kingdom of God would in the future be established. But also preparing the way before his Second Coming was a messenger of whom Elijah was a type. A voice crying out in the worldwide spiritual wilderness of religious confusion, preparing the way for the spiritual glorified King of kings and Lord of lords to come in the supreme power and glory of God to his spiritual temple, the Church (Eph. 2:21), to actually establish the kingdom of God.

Further, in Matthew 17:1-8, Peter, James and John saw the vision of Moses, Elijah and Christ glorified in the kingdom of God. Then in verse 10 the disciples asked Jesus, "Why then say the scribes that Elias [Elijah] must first come?" Remember John the Baptist had finished his ministry and had been imprisoned before Jesus even began his ministry. At the time the disciples asked this question, John the Baptist had come and been put to death. Yet Jesus answered, speaking of the yet future, "[Elijah] truly shall first come, and restore all things" (verse 11).

This could not possibly refer to John the Baptist. John the Baptist restored nothing, but called on people to repent in preparation for the First Coming of Jesus as a physical human.

In the first few years of the New Testament Church, Jesus' true gospel had been suppressed and supplanted with a false gospel -- not the gospel of Christ (the kingdom of God) but man's false gospel about a Christ who did away with his Father's commandments.

Also Malachi 4:5-6 pictures the Elijah to come at the very end of the Church age -- at a time when, if this end-time message were not proclaimed, the glorified Christ would come and smite the world with total destruction. (The word *curse* in this verse is translated from the Hebrew, which in Moffatt's translation is given the meaning *total destruction.*) (Emphasis above, by editor of The Lantern magazine)
